The office is staffed from 8 am-12:00 pm and is available by appointment. Due to safety measures in place, the school will be locked. If you do come to school, you will be asked to self-screen for COVID-19 symptoms. There will be a sign-in form in the front entrance as well as hand sanitizer and gloves. Please wear a mask when you enter the building.

ATTENDANCE

During remote learning, attendance will be taken each day. This is a requirement of the State of Washington. A student will be marked absent if that student does not engage or demonstrate participation during a school day. Realizing that all families and situations are different, there are a variety of ways to participate in learning each day. Student participation includes:

- Daily logins to SeeSaw and completion of learning activities
- Daily interaction with educators, including classroom teachers, specialists such as library, art, and PE, and paraprofessionals.
- Daily participation in live (synchronous) or recorded (asynchronous) instruction. In the instance of recorded instruction, student presence is determined by evidence of logging into SeeSaw

If your child is unable to participate in school as outlined above for the day, please contact your child's teacher.

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REMOTE LEARNING MODEL

Students will be learning five days a week from home with a combination of:

1. Live full-class instruction and small group instruction
2. Independent learning activities.

Live full-class and small group instruction: Students will meet with educators and other students live using Microsoft Teams. Possible activities include:

- Teacher facilitates a discussion about a shared text with the whole class
- Teacher works with a small group in Teams while other students are working independently on an assignment offline
- Students work independently while on video conference; educator monitors work and uses the chat for individual feedback or pulls a small group into a breakout room to share feedback with the group

Independent learning activities: Students will learn independently and offline, on their own timeline.

- Students watch a pre-recorded video lesson on their own schedule
- Students complete assignments posted on Seesaw on their own schedule
- Teacher provides feedback on completed assignments over email or within Seesaw.

PROGRESS MONITORING

At the beginning of the school year, all students will be evaluated to determine learning needs. Teachers will be utilizing district and teacher created assessments to help determine our students' academic needs. North Beach is committed to ensuring all students are brought up to appropriate grade-level standards, despite the extended school closure. Teachers will be planning collaboratively each week and meeting with specialists to determine what supports are appropriate for students. Students will receive traditional standards marking with comments and feedback from teachers on progress reports each trimester. Standards will be marked with 1, 2, 3, 4, or (*) asterisk. Progress reports are marked based on instruction delivered during the trimester, and not on the end of year expectations:

- 4 – means a student's work is exceeding grade-level expectations, based on instruction received during the trimester.
- 3 – means a student is meeting grade-level expectations, based on instruction received during the trimester.
- 2 – means a student is approaching grade-level expectations, based on instruction received during the trimester.
- 1 – means a student is below the grade-level expectations, based on instruction received during the trimester.
- (*) – means the standard is not being evaluated at this time.

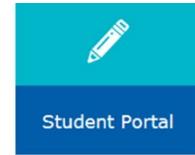

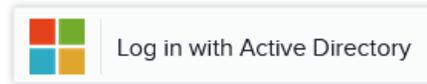

*Online Resources to help with your virtual learning:



Use Student Portal to access Office 365, Schoology, Typing Club, Seesaw and many other district resources. Log in with **Email** and **Password**.



Use the Source to access student progress reports, attendance, School Pay, and other family resources. Login with **parent email** on file with the district and **student's district ID**.



Use Destiny (the Library catalog) to access eBooks, place holds on our school's library books. Login **Username** (without @seattleschools.org) and **Password**.

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NORTH BEACH IS A MEAL DISTRIBUTION SITE

When: Open Monday-Friday, 11:15 a.m. – 1:15 p.m.

What: Pick up sack breakfasts and lunches prepared by our central kitchen; Because of social distancing health guidance, families and students may not stay at school to eat.

Who: Available for all students, parents and guardians

Reheatable Meals by FareStart: Monday through Friday FareStart is providing reheatable prepared meals available for all families to pick up at these school sites.

Weekend Student Meal Support: Meal support for weekends, provided by the Backpack Brigade and Food For Schools, provides non-perishable food items such as canned goods, snacks, juice, etc., is available for all families in need to pick up on Fridays.

How to Pick Up Student Meals

- If you need ADA accessibility support, staff are available to provide access.
- Students and families cannot stay at the school to eat them because of social distancing guidance from state and local health agencies.
- **All students** can pick up meals at these sites. Parents and guardians may pick up meals for students. Students **do not** need to be in attendance.
- If an adult is delivering to non-family members in the community and needs more than 10 meals, they should have an agency badge, be Seattle Public Schools staff, or provide evidence that they are vouched for by Seattle Public Schools staff.

CHILD CARE OPTIONS AT SEATTLE PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Seattle Public Schools (SPS) is partnering with the City of Seattle and community partners to provide full-day child care in nearly 50 elementary and K8 schools while buildings are closed for COVID-19. Enrollment for child care is made through each individual provider. Please see the list of school sites with contact information below.

Child care sites will follow the guidelines for health and safety of the Washington Department of Children Youth and Families, such as health screening at entry, excluding caregivers and children who are showing symptoms of COVID-19, social distancing, hygiene practices and cleaning and disinfecting procedures.

Child care providers will have limited capacity to minimize the risks of spreading coronavirus. SPS has asked our providers to prioritize students furthest from educational justice, and families facing food and housing insecurity, families of essential workers and SPS educators.

SPS is supporting providers' efforts to assist students in accessing remote learning while in child care. Supports include free internet access and trainings for staff on using SPS' learning platforms. When you sign up with a provider, please ask how families and the program can collaborate to support student learning during the day.

This webpage is updated as new sites open and as spaces become available. Each child care provider manages their own enrollment. Please contact them directly.
